

### LETTER FROM THE CHAIR

The trustees were pleased once again by the opportunities in 2006 to support ten diverse projects furthering the mission of our founder, William W. Allen. The projects funded ranged from those close to the Foundation's roots in Midland, Michigan, to those international in origin. Three Midland-area grants focused on nutritional needs of youth and the elderly. Project Fresh, a state of Michigan program, was again funded because of its unique direct service of providing fresh fruits and vegetables to disadvantaged families. Key research grants also were awarded to Geisinger Health System, Children's Hospital in Boston, and the University of Lancaster in England.

The Allen Foundation also welcomed a new trustee. Mary M. Neely is a nutritionist and prominent community leader - qualifications that represent an important addition to our board. It is an honor and a privilege for each of us as trustees to contribute to the furthering of nutrition education, training, and research.

### GRANT APPLICATION PROCEDURE

The Allen Foundation Inc. operates under the laws of the State of Michigan, with offices in Midland. In order to be considered for an Allen Foundation grant, you must be a non-profit organization, and be able to provide us with a copy of your Federal Internal Revenue Service certification of 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status. Academic research under an Allen Foundation grant should be conducted under the leadership of a principal investigator who is a full-time regular faculty member with tenure or on tenure tract. The Foundation does not directly administer the programs which it funds. Recipients are asked to submit yearly progress reports and a financial accounting concerning the expenditures of the Foundation grant.

Grants are strictly limited under the terms of the charter to projects that benefit programs for human nutrition in the areas of health, education, training, and research. The Allen Foundation now requires electronic submission of all unsolicited applications for consideration for possible funding. Please go to http://www.allenfoundation.org/ and follow the instructions for filing a grant application online. The next deadline for submission of proposals is December 31, 2007. This deadline means that any proposal submitted electronically on or after January 1, 2007, will be considered for possible funding in 2008. The decisions of the board of trustees will be posted on the Foundation's website in June of each year. Because of the number of proposals received and the limited resources of the Foundation, applicants should never view possible declinations to fund their proposals or delays in reviewing their proposals as judgments on the actual merits of their proposals.
