

#### LETTER FROM THE CHAIR

The year 2007 was an exciting and productive one for the Allen Foundation. The board of trustees welcomed Mary Neely to the board. Ms. Neely has a professional background in nutrition and has served honorably on the boards of numerous organizations in the Midland area. The foundation also welcomed Anthony Bouwman to the foundation as a junior apprentice – a status allowing him and possibly other interested youths to learn about the nature and the operations of the foundation. The board of trustees extended an invitation to Charles B. Kendall to join the board. Mr. Kendall is a Midland native and is Finance Manager in Corporate Treasury at The Dow Chemical Company. He brings valuable background in finance to the board.

The trustees recommended that graduate students in nutrition programs at prominent public universities be invited to assist with the preliminary grading process of the nearly 500 proposals received each year. In exchange for their willingness to winnow out deficient proposals the foundation would support their second year of a teaching assistantship in their respective departments.

Web page improvements to the Allen Foundation website have enhanced the grant submission process. Applicants can now review, edit or delete their proposals.

### GRANT APPLICATION PROCEDURE

The Allen Foundation Inc. operates under the laws of the State of Michigan, with offices in Midland. In order to be considered for an Allen Foundation grant, you must be a non-profit organization, and be able to provide us with a copy of your Federal Internal Revenue Service certification of 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status. Academic research under an Allen Foundation grant should be conducted under the leadership of a principal investigator who is a full-time regular faculty member with tenure or on tenure tract. The Foundation does not directly administer the programs which it funds. Recipients are asked to submit yearly progress reports and a financial accounting concerning the expenditures of the Foundation grant.

Grants are strictly limited under the terms of the charter to projects that benefit programs for human nutrition in the areas of health, education, training, and research. The Allen Foundation now requires electronic submission of all unsolicited applications for consideration for possible funding. Please go to http://www.allenfoundation.org/ and follow the instructions for filing a grant application online. The next deadline for submission of proposals is December 31, 2008. This deadline means that any proposal submitted electronically on or after January 1, 2009, will be considered for possible funding in 2010. The decisions of the board of trustees will be posted on the Foundation's website in June of each year. Because of the number of proposals received and the limited resources of the Foundation, applicants should never view possible declinations to fund their proposals or delays in reviewing their proposals as judgments on the actual merits of their proposals.
